



We are so excited that you have signed up to be part of the **EXPLORE** option at Summer Camp this July! Below are a few dates and details you need to know so please look this over, discuss it with your parents and let us know if you have any questions. If you want to check out some of Generate Camp will look like, take a look at their Instagram and follow them! Their account is @GenerateYM360.

CAMP DATES: Wednesday July 10 – Sunday July 14

LOCATION: Covenant College (14049 Scenic Highway Lookout Mountain, GA 30750). This camp (Generate Camp) is hosted by YM360: generatestudents.com.

TRAVEL DETAILS: We will meet up at Lakewood in The Lodge at **9:00 a.m. sharp on Wednesday July 10** to load up and depart for camp. We'll be taking a charter bus, Lakewood bus and several rented vans. Our plan is to arrive around noon then eat lunch in town (be sure to bring money for a fast food lunch). For our return trip, we will leave camp the morning of **Sunday July 14 and return to Lakewood by 12:00** (same time the Real Life worship service lets out).

BALANCE AND DEADLINES: The total cost for this **EXPLORE** camp option is \$389 (including the \$75 deposit). However, you may have had one or more promotions based on when you signed-up or because of the sibling scholarship. We mailed you a letter over a month ago with the total amount you still owe but if you have questions about this, please contact Jessica Hart in our Student Ministry office (jhart@lakewoodlife.org or 770-532-6307). You can pay this balance anytime on our camp website (lakewoodlife.org/summercamp) or in The Lodge but this is due **no later than Sunday June 23**.

WAIVERS AND RELEASE FORMS: Everyone attending **EXPLORE** at Summer Camp needs to turn in 3 important forms: a current Lakewood Student Ministry Release Form, a YM360 Waiver/Release Form AND a Rafting Waiver (included here). The YM360 form that we mailed to you must be notarized (both Jessica in our student ministry office and Nancy in the front office at church are notaries). Many of you already have a Lakewood Release Form on file from previous events this year but you can check with Jessica in our student ministry office if you're not sure. These forms are available in The Lodge but may also be downloaded from lakewoodlife.org/summercamp. Please turn these forms in to our student ministry office as soon as possible but **no later than Sunday June 23**. You must have both of these forms to attend Summer Camp.

SCHEDULE: Be sure to check out the attached schedule to see what we'll be doing at camp. For **EXPLORE**, our schedule is different as we'll be going off-site during the day between 10-3 for several activities including: White Water Rafting, the Chattanooga Aquarium and Hiking. These are already included in your cost for camp so no additional payment is required. While we are going off-site, we will still meet in our Bible study groups during this time and have lunch together.

TALENT SHOW: There will be a camp-wide Talent Show on Night 2 of camp called "The Get Down." Each year at The Get Down, everyone is encouraged to wear clothes that match the theme for the night. This summer, the theme for The Get Down is the 80s!

FREE TIME OPTIONS: Sand volleyball, pool, indoor basketball courts and frisbee golf.

LODGING AND MEALS: Most dorms house 2 to 8 per room with either a private bath or community-style bath. Students will be put into rooms with other Lakewood students based on the preferences you gave us. The cafeteria or the “Great Hall” as it is known, offers a few varieties of hot foods, a full salad bar, a sandwich bar, and a choice of desserts daily. We will let you know about the rooming list when you arrive at camp.

MEDICINE POLICY: As a ministry, one of our primary responsibilities is to be sure that all of our students are safe and healthy while away on student ministry trips. One of the new ways we plan to ensure this is by requiring students to turn-in all prescription medications at check-in. A designated staff/volunteer leader will give out this medication as needed throughout the week. This way, we can be sure that only students with a prescription have access to their medication and that they will take their meds at the appropriate times. We will have over-the-counter medications available (such as Advil, Tylenol, Benadryl) and give these to students as needed (unless we hear otherwise from you as their parent). Additionally, we will be carrying a fully-stocked First Aid kit. For prescription medication, please read and adhere to the following guidelines below and let anyone on our student ministry staff know if you have any questions. Know that this information will be kept confidential and that medication will be kept in a safe place.

- Place the medication(s) in original container/packaging and put this in a zip lock bag with an index card.
- The index card should contain the following information: student’s name, name of medication, dosage, time for administration (breakfast, lunch, dinner or bedtime) and any special instructions.
- Students may keep and take their own non-prescription meds (such as allergy medicine) if it’s kept in an original container/packaging but they are not to share this with anyone else. However, if you would like for us to dispense any non-prescription meds, please include this in the ziplock bag with an index card containing the information listed above.
- If a student has any emergency medication such as an EpiPen or Inhaler that needs to be kept with them at all times, please write this down on an index card to be turned in at check-in.

CAMP GUIDELINES

GENERAL

- Everyone is expected to have a great attitude and to live out the highest standards of Christian conduct at all times during this week of camp. Remember, you represent Jesus Christ, your family and Lakewood.
- Don't bring any of the following: drugs, alcohol, tobacco, fireworks, weapons of any kind, clothing with alcoholic or vulgar images/slogans, gaming consoles (PS4, XBOX, etc.).
- All students are expected to attend everything on the schedule and to be on time.
- All students are expected to be with other students from Lakewood at all times (never go anywhere alone)
- No PDA (public displays of affection).
- No guys allowed in girls' rooms and no girls allowed in guys' rooms.
- Be aware that you are responsible for any damages to your room.
- All students are expected to stay within the designated camp area and not to go off the property (unless you are part of the High School EXPLORE option where you will leave campus with our adult leaders).
- Students may bring cell phones and other devices for the bus ride to and from camp and to contact their parents during the week. Upon arrival, adult leaders will collect and safely store devices. Students may retrieve their phone to contact their parents at select times during the day. Students may also use a leader's phone to contact parents at any time upon request. We have enacted this policy to: (1) prevent the viewing or sharing of inappropriate content, (2) prevent the loss or destruction of property, (3) prevent negative communication among students, and (4) prevent distractions from the purpose of camp.

DRESS CODE FOR GUYS

- Please make sure all attire is modest and appropriate.
- No speedos or anything that semi-resembles a speedo.
- Unless you're at the pool, wear a shirt at all times that completely covers the chest/torso.
- No sagging of shorts, pants or swim trunks.

DRESS CODE FOR GIRLS

- Please make sure all attire is modest and appropriate.
- One piece bathing suits (no cutouts) OR tankini's that fully cover the stomach are fine. Tankini tops must remain down at all times, if not you will be asked to put on a cover up. Straps are required!
- Stomach should be covered at all times.
- All shirts and dresses should have a modest neckline.
- No halter/tube/spaghetti strap tops. Tank tops that are at least 3 fingers wide can be worn during the day but not to evening worship. No oversized tank tops that show your sides.
- No Demin shorts or other "short" shorts or skirts. Skirts and dresses should keep you fully covered when bending over. If you have any questions about this, you may talk with one of our female leaders.

NOTE: We have great expectations for this week of Camp and are not anticipating any major issues. However, anyone who chooses not to comply with these guidelines will be subject to a disciplinary process such as a loss of free time, having your device taken up or calling your parents. If these actions continue and/or if there is a serious offense, this may result in you being sent home at your parent's expense.

Waiver and Release of Liability
 PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

In consideration of **Outland Expeditions, Inc.** furnishing services and/or equipment to enable me to participate in white water rafting, funyaking, hiking, camping, climbing and/or other outdoor activities, I agree as follows:

I fully understand and acknowledge that outdoor recreational activities have: (a) inherent risks, dangers and hazards and such exists in my use of white water rafting and/or climbing equipment and participation in such activities; (b) my participation in such activities and/or use of such equipment may result in injury or illness including, but not limited to bodily injury, disease, strains, fractures, partial and/or total paralysis, death or other ailments that could cause serious disability; (c) these risks and dangers may be caused by the negligence of the owners, employees, officers or agents of **Outland Expeditions, Inc.**; the negligence of the participants, the negligence of others, accidents, breaches of contract, the forces or nature or other causes. Risks and dangers may arise from foreseeable or unforeseeable causes including, but not limited to, guide decision making, including that a guide may misjudge terrain, weather, trail or river route location, and water level, risks of falling out of or drowning while in a raft, canoe or kayak and such other risks, hazards and dangers are integral to recreational activities that take place in a wilderness, outdoor or recreational environment; and (d) by my participation in these activities and/or use of equipment, I hereby assume all risks and dangers and all responsibility for any losses and/or damages, whether caused in whole or in part by the negligence or other conduct of the owners, agents, officers, or employees of **Outland Expeditions, Inc.**, or by any other person.

I, on behalf of myself, my personal representatives and my heirs hereby voluntarily agree to release, waive, discharge, hold harmless, defend and indemnify **Outland Expeditions, Inc.** and its owners, agents, officers and employees from any and all claims, actions or losses for bodily injury, property damage, wrongful death, loss of services or otherwise which may arise out of my use of **Outland Expeditions, Inc.** equipment or my participation in white water rafting and/or climbing activities. I specifically understand that I am releasing, discharging and waiving any claims or actions that I may have presently or in the future for the negligent acts or other conduct by the owners, agents, officers or employees of **Outland Expeditions, Inc.**

I further agree to indemnify and hold harmless the United States, TVA, Alcoa Power, Ocoee River Outfitters Association, The Appalachian Growth Fund III, the State of Tennessee, the State of North Carolina, and their respective agents, servants and employees from any and all claims, demands, actions and judgments arising at any time out of or in any way connected with my use of the white water recreation area or the Ocoee River or the Cheoah River and activities incidental thereto.

The Venue of any dispute that may arise out of this agree or otherwise between the parties to which the **Outland Expeditions, Inc.** and its agents is a party shall be either the city of Cleveland, Tennessee Justice Court or the County or State Supreme Court in Bradley County.

I HAVE READ THE ABOVE WAIVER AND RELEASE AND BY SIGNING IT AGREE. IT IS MY INTENTION TO EXEMPT AND RELIEVE **OUTLAND EXPEDITIONS, INC.** FROM LIABILITY FOR PERSONAL INJURY, PROPERTY DAMAGE OR WRONGFUL DEATH CAUSED BY NEGLIGENCE OR ANY OTHER CAUSE.
